

Current Action for NSW Ambulance ADHSU Members

Effective from first day shift Friday 17 February until first day shift Saturday 18 February (24 hours of action)

Members on Road (industrial action)

- No shift movements unless overtime has been exhausted at the destination station (has to be advertised on Teams or text request for at least an hour).
- No hospital hospital R3s or below. This does not include R4s or sporting events, or from Aged Care facilities.
- No pressing off stretcher crews will not update MDT when off stretcher until they are complete and ready to make themselves available.
- Duty crews not to attend SEC events, including trackwork, when not staffed with OT

Members on Road (Non-industrial action)

- Only wearing their undershirt and safety vest while on duty (with ADHSU front and rear insert).
- Chalking continues

Effective from first day shift Friday 17 February until notified otherwise (indefinite)

Members on Road

• No P5s: all patients who wish to be transported to hospital will be transported to hospital. This is not industrial action because NSW paramedics are not getting paid for the required medical reasoning to safely P5 a patient.

Members in Education

• Education members will continue to defer teaching upskilling components of MCPD and Inservice, as continuing to take on more skills without recognition cannot continue.

Members Completing MCPD or Inservice

- In conjunction with this members attending MCPD will to defer the upskilling components, as follows:
 - Decompression of Tension Pneumothorax
 - Corpuls members will continue to use the current LifePak 15 to ensure patient safety.
 - o PEEP
 - o CPAP
 - o Preceptorship
 - Capnography
 - o End tidal CO2
