

HealthShare Patient Transport Industrial Action Called Off

Dear Member,

For weeks, the HSU has been at loggerheads with the Ministry of Health in the IRC over their failure to ensure staff and patient safety in and around public hospitals. However, there has been some ground made during discussions, and as a show of good faith the HSU has agreed to relax some of the industrial action being undertaken by members. The nature of the action now being taken will make it impracticable for NEPT members to take part, **therefore strike action will be suspended for NEPT.**

An incredible 70% of ADHSU respondents in Patient Transport Services survey voted to go on strike to fight for better safety standards for health care workers across NSW. This shows impressive strength and unity amongst members in the Ambulance Division, and your show of solidarity has been passed on to your fellow workers in other health services.

It is still encouraged that HSU members wear their safety vests to work tomorrow to show the ministry that this fight will continue.
