

Wage Theft: Were you forced to do overtime at casual rates at National Patient Transport?

ADHSU members working at National Patient Transport have brought to our attention that NPT has been paying casual rates for overtime shifts worked. After further investigation, it seems the problem is quite widespread and may affect our members that have already moved on to NSW Ambulance or other private companies.

This is wage theft, plain and simple, even if you signed an Individual Flexibility Agreement. Any agreement signed that allows NPT to pay you below the award rate is illegal. We know that National Patient Transport can afford it, and you worked hard on the overtime shift so you deserve the legally required minimum pay rate.

- Full Name
- Contact details
- Length of time with NPT (Dates if you have them)
- Whether you worked a regular overtime shift (every week), or on occasion.

Please sign the petition that will be circulating around National Patient Transport sites in the coming weeks. This will prove to National Patient Transport that you will not be walked over by a multi-national corporation.
